VAUDEVILLE RETURNS

rom the late 1800's through the early 20th Century, Vaudville was the common people's theatrical experience. Across America and around the world, this wildly popular genre featured variety acts of countless descriptions and later included film programs. Alex Film Society's annual recreation of the nostalgic program is the only Vaudville show produced regularly in Los Angeles.

Built in 1925, the lovingly restored Alex Theatre was reopened by the City of Glendale in 1994. It stands today as one of the most important surviving examples of grand Vaudville and movie palaces of the early 20th century and one of the very few extant theatres with an open forecourt. It is operated by Glendale Arts.

A traditional, or dixieland band, NBJ was formed in 1975 to represent the Society for the Preservation of Dixieland Jazz at the annual Sacramento Jubilee. It's one of the busiest bands in the nation.
